



Upwards Trend at the 2nd Alsfelder Advent

Verden. The sales collection of the 2nd Alsfelder Advent in the Hessen Horse Centre included 38 riding horses. The selection committee had assembled a collection that exactly matched the requirements and ideas of customers from all over the world. Reglisse was the top-priced auction horse. Euro 42,000 was the price paid for the eagerly moving mare.

Reglisse by Rascalino/Woodstock (breeder and exhibitor: Henning Brandt, Walsrode) knew how to highlight her special skills: The four-year-old black mare shined with her elastic and supple trot. Team Olympic Champion Martin Schaudt purchased the top sport horse at Euro 42,000. The price for Let's Dance was almost as high. The typey bay horse by London Swing/Silvano (breeder and exhibitor: Reiner Bechstein, Alheim) captivated the audience during all presentations in the Alsfeld auction ring. A training stable from Lower Saxony paid Euro 41,000 for the Hanoverian horse with the show experiences.

Top-priced jumper was the four-year-old bay mare Sherry by Stolzenberg/Graf Grannus (breeder and exhibitor: August Struß, Elze). Horse experts from Russia recognized her extraordinary qualities for show jumping sport and spent Euro 32,000.

The customers paid averagely Euro 14,831.57 for the 38 auction horses, approx. Euro 3,000 more than last year. Three youngsters will leave Germany and start their career abroad.

Auctioneer Friedrich-Wilhelm Isernhagen was happy: "This was an excellent finish of the year. People here show that much enthusiasm, this is indeed very impressive." Breeding and business manager Dr. Werner Schade gave a positive summary of the last sales event of the Hannoveraner Verband in 2010: „The second sales event in Alsfeld was a clear step forward. The increased quality of horses was honoured. New customers from
