

Jörg-Wilhelm Wegener new Auction Manager

Vacant post filled again after a few weeks

Verden. Jörg-Wilhelm Wegener will be the new manager of the Training and Sales Centre of the Hannoveraner Verband in Verden. The Executive Board made this decision on Wednesday. The 31-year-old Wegener, who previously was deputy manager, will be the fourth auction manager in the history of the famous Verden auctions.

Jörg-Wilhelm Wegener has been working in the Training and Sales Centre of the Hannoveraner Verband since April 2006. He was hitherto responsible for the international customers and focused on the marketing and sales of the auction jumpers. Last year, he was appointed deputy auction manager.

The breeder's son was committed to horses and agriculture when he started his professional career: He accomplished his apprenticeship with Hans-Heinrich Phillipps at the Klostersgut Mönchhof in Wunstorf. Following his compulsory military service and his technical diploma, he studied agricultural science at the University of Applied Science in Osnabrück, focused on economics. He changed to the Oldenburger Verband in Vechta in 2005 where he occupied the post of an auction assistant. One year later, he started to work for the Hannoveraner Verband in Verden.

Jörg-Wilhelm Wegener comes from a dedicated breeder's family. The rider earned victories and placements in the course including advanced level on home-bred Hanoverian horses. The auction manager looks forward to his new professional challenge: "The reconstruction works of the Niedersachsenhalle will be completely finished in a couple of weeks. We will then have a modern sales centre that is unrivalled in Germany and that provides all the facilities required to perfectly care for customers and exhibitors."

Breeding and business manager Dr. Werner Schade explained: "The Executive Board of the Hannoveraner Verband has appointed a new auction manager who – with all his competence – knows how to perfectly combine sport, breeding and sales. "
